

In Fiscal Year 2014-2015 when the Florida Legislature invested 100%, Indian River County-based arts and cultural nonprofits generated

\$1,127,000 back to LOCAL government treasury; \$1,893,000 back to STATE government treasury for a total of \$3,020,000 returned to government treasuries.
